Clerk Report:

- 1. Town and County taxes for 2016 are arriving progressively.
- 2. Warrant Amount is \$1,300,052.66.
- 3. End collection date is March 15, 2016.
- 4. Payments to Supervisor will total \$585,528.30.

Privilege of the Floor was given to Carol Weaver and Tracy Tanner, both representing Bodman Memorial Library.

- 1. Carol wished to thank the Town of Philadelphia for being a funding member.
- 2. Bobman Memorial Library's 2015 Budget was discussed. (Please see attached budget)
- 3. Funding for the renovation project has been released by NY State. There is hope the project will be completed by Spring 2016.
- 4. The Renovation Project will include a meeting room, private room for tutoring, a reading room, director's office and kitchenette.

- 5. A Smart TV and necessary equipment to accommodate long distance meetings and videoconferencing.
- 6. Currently have 1,327 registered borrowers
- 7. SCOLA is now available for Philadelphia Patrons.
- 8. Ancestery.com can be accessed only from the computers inside the Library.
- 9. Five new Public Access Computers and a Laptop have been purchased.
- 10. Classes will be offered in the coming months on Computer Basics, Microsoft Word, Internet Browsing, Email, downloading Emedia and Smartphone usage.
- 11. Tutors and Proctored Exams are available.

Highway Report:

- 1. New pickup has been ordered.
- 2. There will be a traffic light installed by NYS-DOT, at the intersection of NYS Route 11 and County Route 29 in 2016.
- 3. All needed repair is being done on Town Highway Trucks.
- 4. Outside lights at the Recycling Center have been repaired.

Supervisor Horton said she had spoken with James Koch from Indian River School regarding an Area Variance presented to the Town Planning Board by Luke Martin/North Country Storage Barns. Mr. Martin must put up a fence on the boundary property line with Indian River Central School.

Assessor Report:

Orientation by Paul Warneck for newly elected Assessor, Tamrica Brown is planned for July. A Capitalization Course will be scheduled.
